THE UNDERSIGNED, AS SECRETARY OF STATE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS, HEREBY CERTIFIES THAT THE ATTACHED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION FOR THE ABOVE NAMED CORPORATION HAVE BEEN RECEIVED IN THIS OFFICE AND ARE FOUND TO CONFORM TO LAW.

The undersigned persons, acting as incorporators of a corporation under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, set forth in Texas Revised Statutes articles 1396-1.01 et seq., adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation:

Article I

The name of the corporation is LCU Hallelujah Chorus, Inc.

Article II

The corporation is a not for profit corporation.

Article III

The corporation will have perpetual duration.

Article IV

The purposes for which the corporation is organized are:

(a) The specific and primary purposes for which this corporation is formed are to develop funds for Christian Education, promote Lubbock Christian University (affiliated with Churches of Christ,) and provide a ministry to area churches and other groups by organizing a chorus, providing scholarships, and otherwise encouraging Christian fellowship.

(b) The general purposes for which this corporation is formed are to operate exclusively for such charitable, educational and religious purposes as will qualify it as an exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws, including, for such purposes, the making of distributions to organizations which qualify as tax-exempt organizations under that Code.

(c) This corporation will not, as a substantial part of its activities, carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation; nor will it participate or intervene (by publication or distribution of any statements or otherwise) in any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office.

Article V

Directors as Membership

The sole class of members of this corporation shall be its directors. The authorized number and qualifications of the members

of the corporation, the manner of their admission, and other rights and privileges of members shall be set forth in the bylaws.

Rights and Liabilities of Members

The members of this corporation shall have no right, title, or interest whatsoever in its income, property, or assets, nor shall any portion of such income, property, or assets be distributed to any member on the dissolution or winding up of this corporation. Members of this corporation shall not be personally liable for the debts, liabilities, or obligations of the corporation, and shall not be subject to any assessments.

Article VI

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 1707 Pontiac Ave., Lubbock, Texas 79416. The name of its initial registered agent at such address is Wayne Hinds.

Article VII

The powers of this corporation shall be exercised, its property controlled, and its affairs conducted by its board of directors. The names and residential addresses of the persons who are to serve as the initial directors are attached as an addendum hereto.

Article VIII

Article IX

The board of directors will elect the following officers: President, vice presidents, secretary, and treasurer, and such other officers as the bylaws of this corporation may authorize the directors to elect from time to time.

Article X

Subject to the limitations contained in the bylaws and any limitations set forth in the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act described above, concerning corporate action that is required to be authorized or approved by the members of the corporation, the bylaws of this corporation may be made, altered, rescinded, added to, or new bylaws may be adopted, either by a resolution of the

board of directors or by following the procedure set forth for such action in the bylaws.

Article XI

The property of this corporation is irrevocably dedicated to charitable, educational and religious purposes and no part of the net income or assets of this corporation will ever inure to the benefit of any director, officer, or member of the corporation, or to the benefit of any private individual.

Article XII

Upon the dissolution or winding up of this corporation, its assets remaining after payment, or provision for payment, of all debts and liabilities of the corporation, will be distributed to a non-profit fund, foundation, or corporation which organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational, or religious purposes, and which has established its tax exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or corresponding provisions of any subsequent federal tax laws.

Article XIII

Amendments to these articles of incorporation may be proposed by a resolution adopted by the board of directors and presented to a quorum of members for their vote. Amendments may be adopted by a vote of at least two-thirds of a quorum of members of the corporation.

We, the undersigned, being the incorporators of this corporation, for the purpose of forming this nonprofit corporation under the Laws of Texas, have executed these articles

of incorporation on May 22, 2001.
